PAM had its genesis a hundred years ago with the Singapore Society of Architect's (SSA), during a roaring global economic boom.



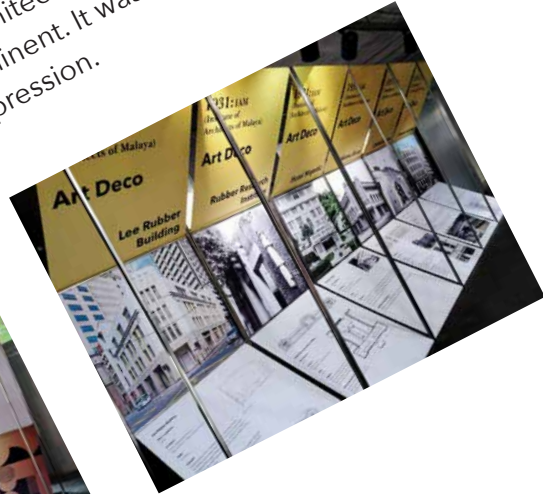
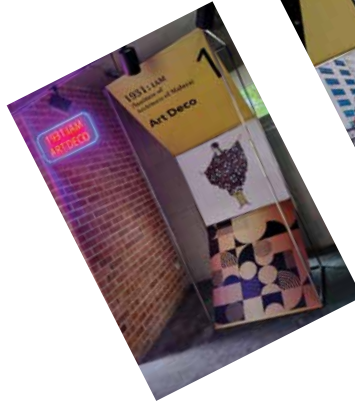

FMSA was set up after WWII based closely on the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA) but with the intention of localizing the architectural profession, with several local architects in council.

This marked the beginning of sustainable measuring tool for Malaysia's green buildings. Since 2007 over 3000 buildings have been certified "green" in Malaysia.

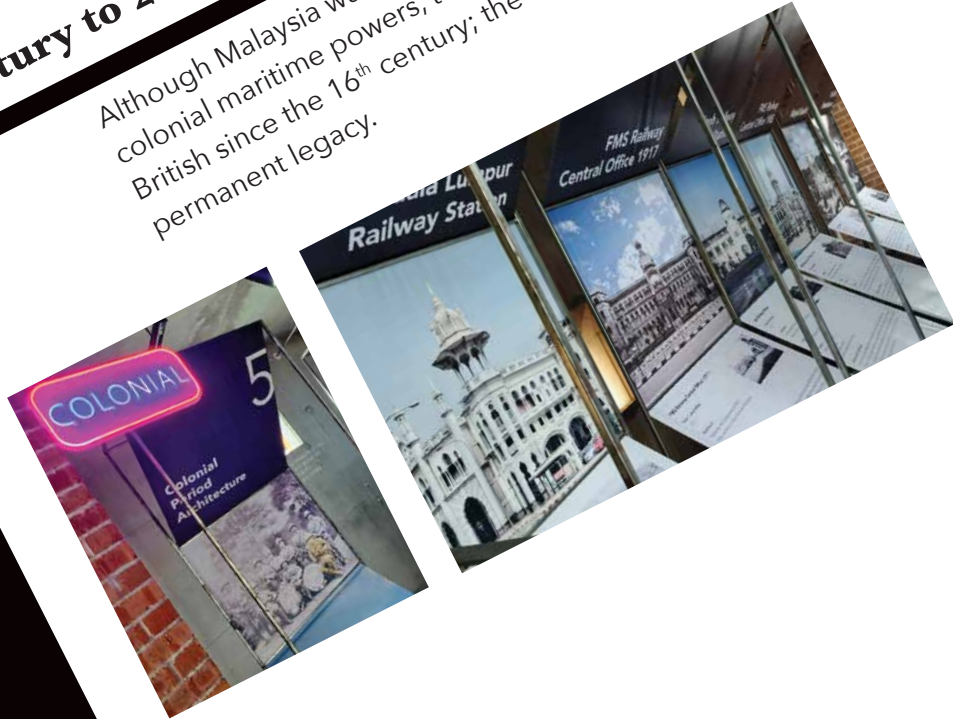
