PERTUBUHAN AKITEK MALAYSIA (PAM) and the Red Crescent Malaysia launches Donation Campaign in joint effort initiatives to help the Typhoon Haiyan Victims in Philippines.

PAM (PERTUBUHAN AKITEK MALAYSIA-MALAYSIAN INSTITUTE of ARCHITECTS) and PERSATUAN BULAN SABIT MALAYSIA (The Malaysian Red Crescent Society) launched a campaign called "Architects Malaysia for Haiyan Philippines" to help victims of Typhoon Haiyan which destroyed parts of the Philippines earlier this month.

The abovementioned is a joint donation campaign initiated by PAM jointly with Persatuan Bulan Sabit Merah Malaysia. Every dollar raised from this month long campaign will be remitted to Persatuan Bulan Sabit Merah Malaysia who will subsequently channel the funds to the Philippines' Red Cross without any administration charges.

The campaign will commence from 18th November 2013 and end on 17th December 2013 with the intention to raise 'Emergency Relief Funds' from PAM's Members and the general public at large.

Donations via cheques must be made payable to PERTUBUHAN AKITEK MALAYSIA and 100% of the proceeds will go to victims of Typhoon Haiyan in Philippines.

It can be said that Typhoon Haiyan, which hit central Philippine on 8th November this year is one of the strongest storm that has ever hit the islands of Philippines.

Most of the island in the hilly region of Eastern Visayas and four other islands were affected by it. These were followed by other provinces such as Layte, Cebu and Iloila. Over 125,000 victims took refuge in evacuations centres.

According to the Secretary General of the Philippine Red Cross, over 90% of the infrastructure were destroyed. It is estimated that over 25 areas were hit and the assessment teams are on standby to enter the stricken areas as soon as condition permits. The Secretary General went on to say that it is expected that the casualty toll will rise as soon as aid workers reach the affected areas where flood waters were as high as 10 feet.

Although the overall impact of the typhoon has only just emerged, Philippine Red Cross staff and volunteers from within the affected location have reported that there are significant number of casualties and damages.

According to the latest update released by the Disaster Risk Reduction and Response Operations Office (DRRROO) in the Philippine Department of Social Welfare (DSWD), a total of 944,586 families or 4,283,290 people have been affected across 39 provinces with 71,623 families or 330,914 people sheltered in 1,223 Evacuation Centres that are operational. In addition to it, over 3,438 houses are damaged and 2,055 of them are completely destroyed.

As one of the 184 National Societies affiliated under the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies around the world, the Malaysian Red Crescent Society will be sending our very own Rapid Deployment Squad (RDS) and volunteers to assist the Philippine Red Cross in their rescue and recovery operation. The MRC Squad will be led by YBhg Datuk Wira Dr. Hj Bahari bin Datuk Abu Mansor, National Vice Chairman and Chairman, National Disaster Management & Emergency Ambulance Committee.

The Malaysian Red Crescent in collaboration with PAM (PERTUBUHAN AKITEK MALAYSIA- Malaysia Institute of Architects) would also like to call on all Malaysians, individuals and corporations alike, to come forward and lend a helping hand by sending in your generous contribution to help alleviate the suffering of the victims of the Typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines.
