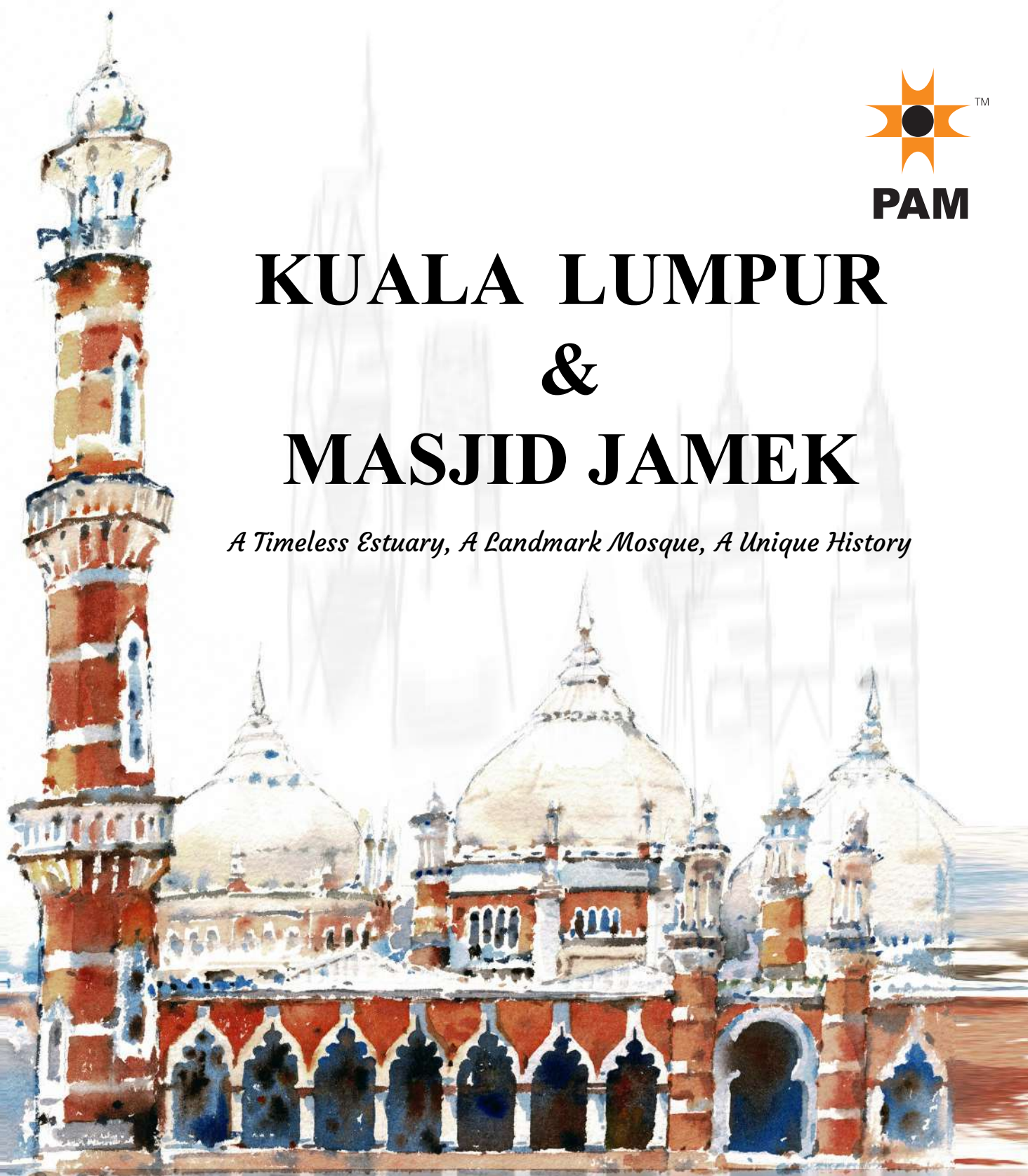
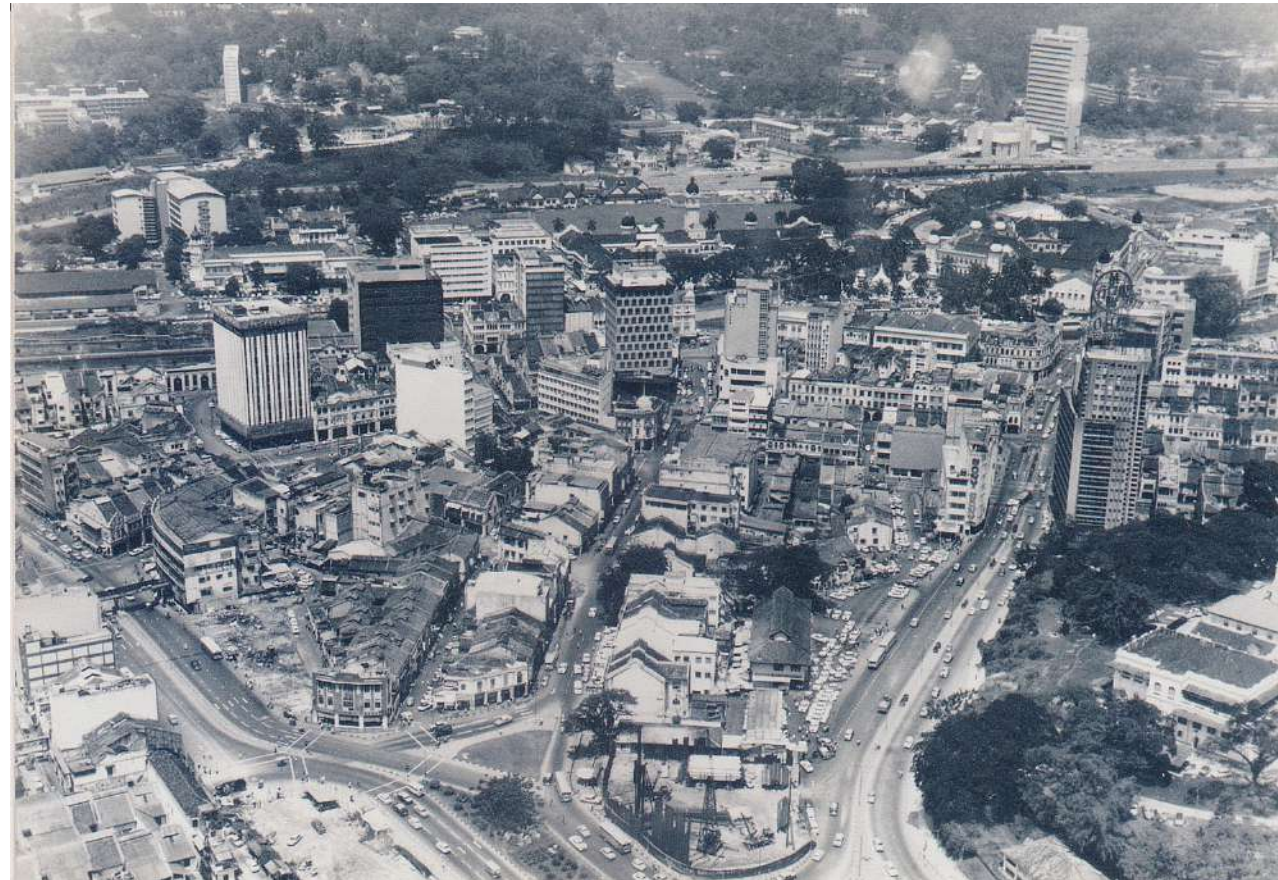

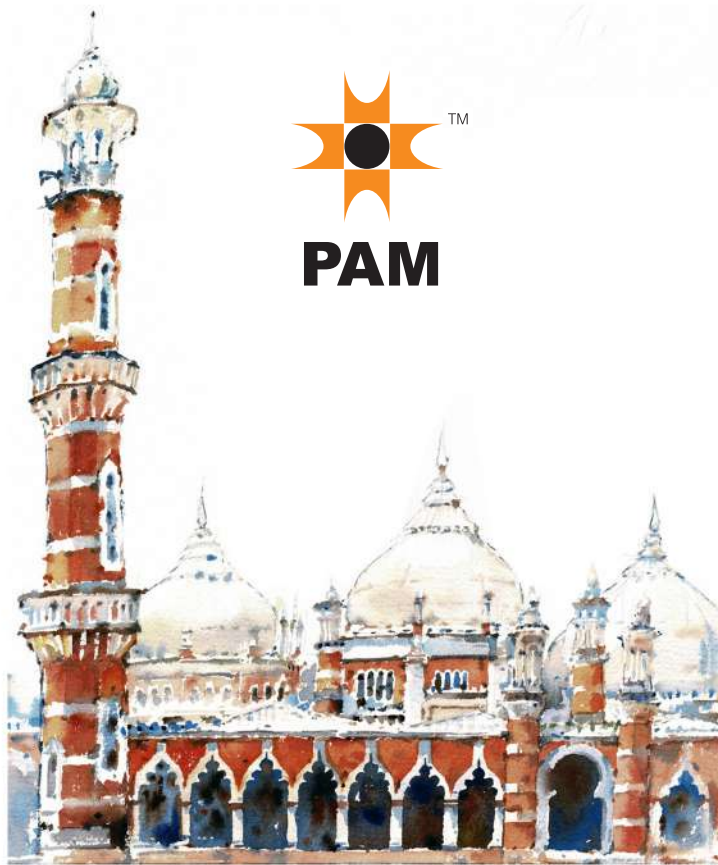
*Aerial view of Kuala Lumpur in 1960s.

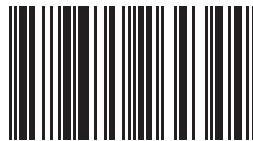
